Here's a translation of Liu Jiacheng's caption:

I was so touched I cried, I won't leave such a good company even if you beat me to death!!! I love you SBS Transit!!!"

(Note: "Even if you beat me to death" is a common Chinese phrase to mean "no matter what happens".)

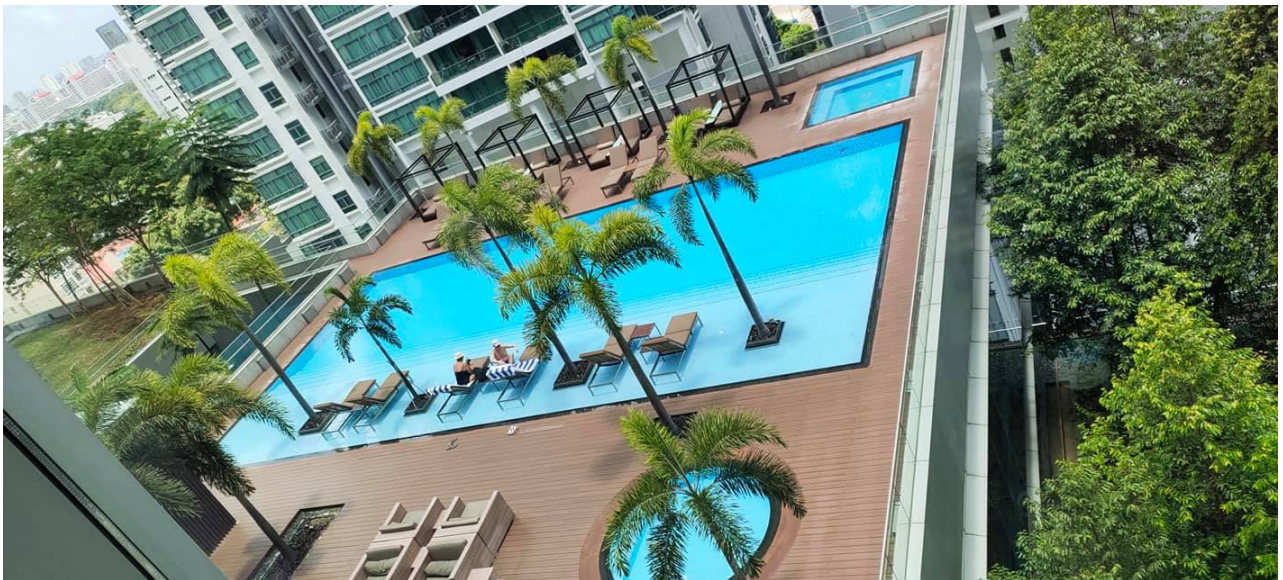

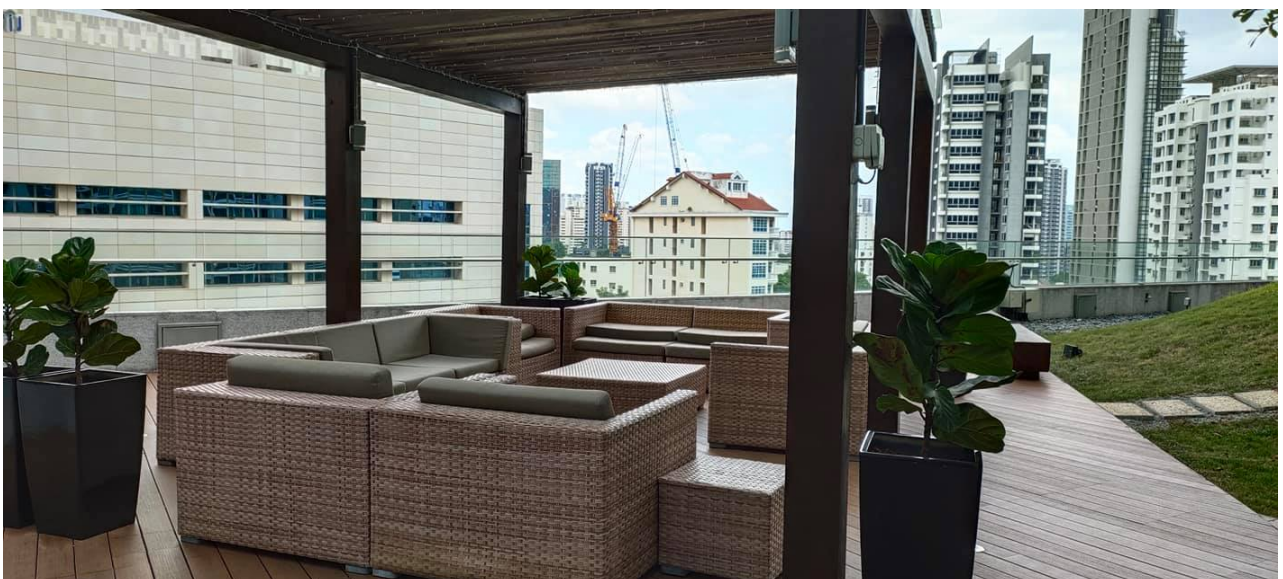

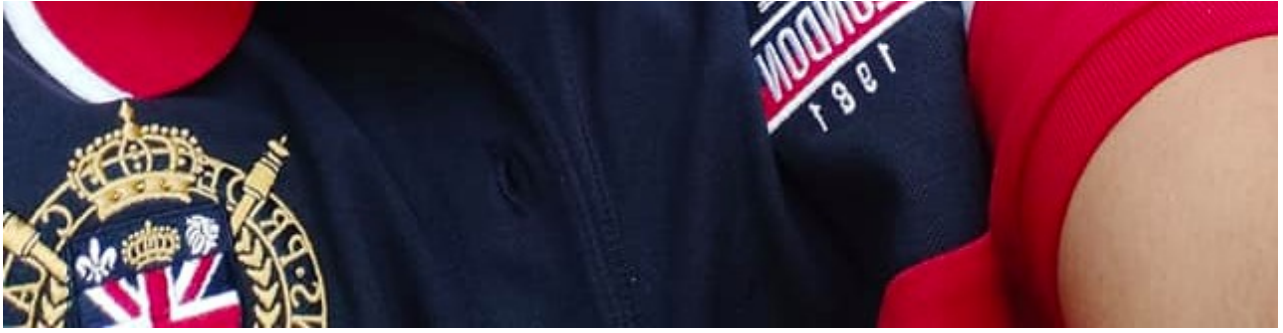

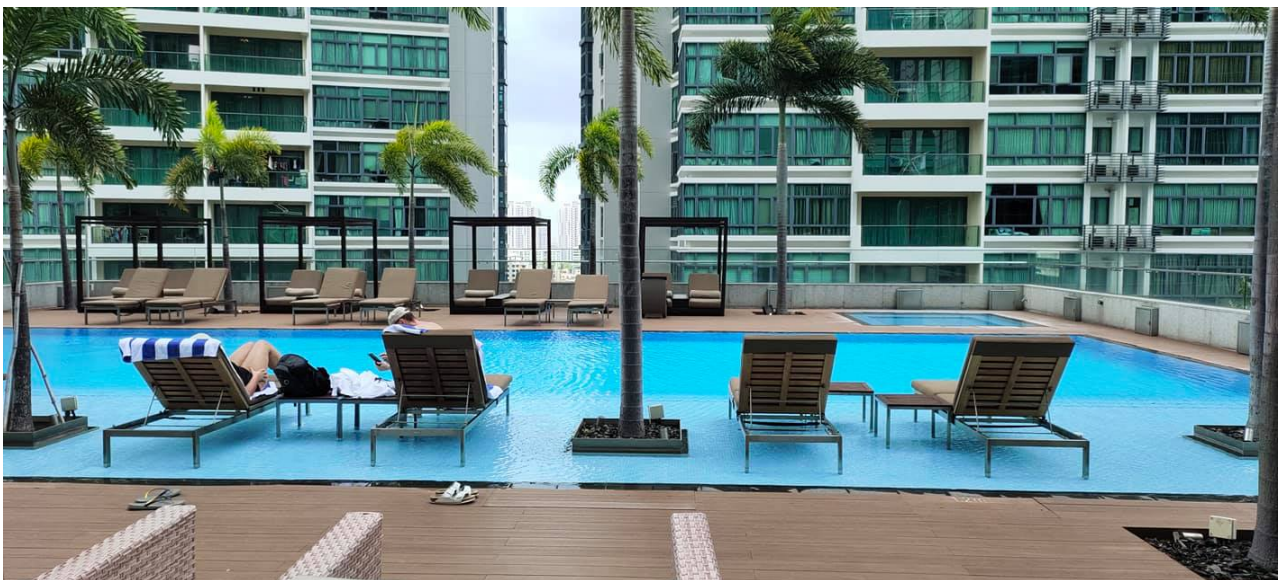

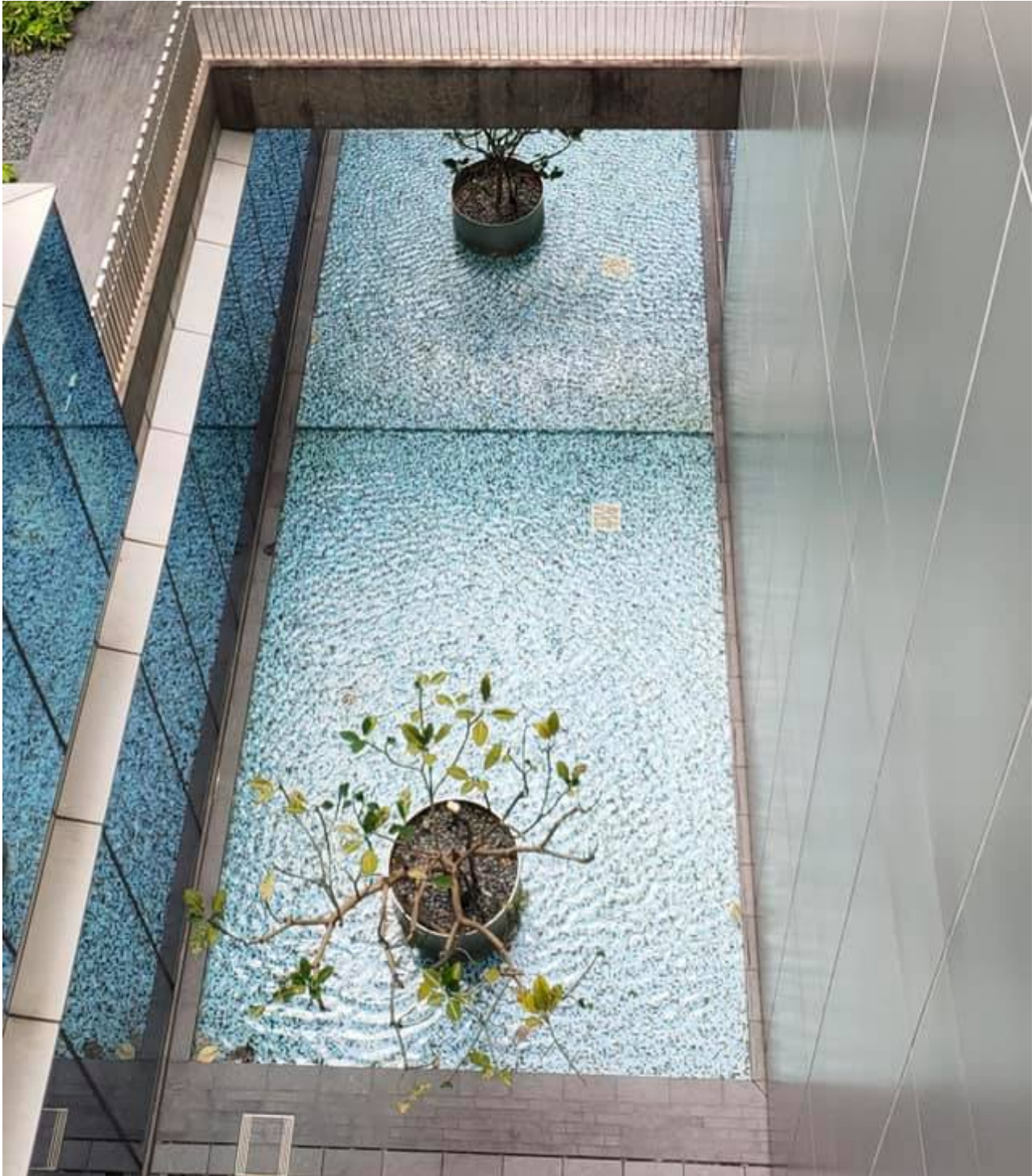
